#Take A Stand Against Domestic Violence

October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month (**DVAM**). This month we amplify our call to action to all community members to engage in prevention of domestic violence and abuse. Each of us can create change in our own communities, either through direct advocacy to end domestic violence or by addressing its root causes in our day to day lives. We commemorated DVAM through



various activities. We engaged young minds with an our annual online Art Fest campaign to uphold values of love, compassion and peace through art and poetry. We produced a PSA where teen leaders pledged to end gender-based violence. We published podcasts and attended community talks to renew our vows to support survivors and hold perpetrators accountable. Throughout this month, through various ways we sent out a message to our community members, that together we can foster social justice, reframe masculinity, eliminate oppressive patriarchy, and engage in activism and policy advocacy to change harmful social and cultural conditions that enable domestic violence.

Policy Based Prevention

The shelter-in-place orders in California and around the world have increased the existing danger for individuals living in abusive relationships. Increased requests for intervention and legal remedies over the past few months have shed light on the ongoing need for resources. The intersections of homelessness, poverty, gender inequality and







immigration with domestic violence have become even more apparent. At Maitri, we saw immigrants with limited English proficiency experiencing additional suffering brought on by system-based barriers. Talks Around Prevention

In the last guarter, Maitri representatives participated in and delivered a few educational sessions and trainings for community members and service providers. Maitri board President Sonya Pelia attended a panel on Radio Zindagi in raising awareness against domestic violence. Maitri staff, Zakia Afrin presented 2 training sessions at the Superior Court of Santa Clara County on the impact of COVID-19 on survivors and another training to the trainee advocates at AACI on the importance of providing cultural responsive services. Maitri staff, Nandini Ray, led a community discussion with a group of Airbnb Inc. employees focusing on community involvement in IPV prevention. She also presented to a large group of students of Quarry Lane High School, educating teens about red flags in toxic relationships, and on the importance of building healthy relationships. Maitri was also invited by the Office of Gender-Based Violence Prevention, Santa Clara County to share our prevention program highlights for FY2019-20 at their quarterly session with service providers.

Prevention Campaigns

In our work we have realized that we cannot make progress in establishing gender equity and ending domestic violence unless we engage men and youth in raising

awareness. Last quarter 6 men joined our **#Engaging Men and Boys campaign** and shared their valuable insights in preventing gender violence and partner violence, and 7 teens took part in our **#BuildingHealthyRelationships campaign** to mobilize their communities in building healthy relationships.
