EEP Speaker Series

A 6-part webinar series, **Between Friends: Sharing Knowledge and Experience** hosted by the Maitri Economic Empowerment Program presented two webinars in the last quarter. We focused on crucial topics like "What To Do While You Wait" and "Women and Money".

Many community members actively participated and shared their takeaways from our webinars. One attendee pointed out how the discussion resonated with her. She said "I especially liked the explanation around why women should look to continue working even if childcare is expensive. Having career continuity, staying relevant with skills and also investing in retirement makes a great case for staying in the workforce." Another member shared her experience "Because I am a good example of being a victim of financial abuse which I did not know even existed until I got separated though I was seeing red flags. Glad Maitri has taken the initiative to educate women on the financial front."

Prevention Campaigns

We continue to engage men and youth through our prevention campaigns. Men participate in raising awareness in preventing gender based violence and partner violence, and teens in mobilizing their communities in building healthy relationships.
