Maitri celebrated 26 years of serving the South Asian community on issues of familial violence, trafficking, and cultural alienation with a glittering and successful gala (album) in February raising over \$550,000. A strong message of hope, empowerment, and transformation was conveyed. The event included a musical medley by



the award winning student choir Harker Cantilena, a dance performance by internationally acclaimed Kathak choreographer and dancer Farah Yasmeen Shaikh and her Noorani group, and a powerfully spoken narrative featuring testimonials of two Maitri clients. The evening was emceed by Reshma Dordi, host of a South Asian TV show Showbiz India.

As always, this was made possible with the generosity and support from our community. Together we hope to continue to transform lives and uplift communities.

Busy Last Quarter

Community Engagement: We believe, it is very important to work with different sections of our community to create a culture where there is zero tolerance for domestic violence. Maitri was invited by different community groups to introduce Maitri to their event attendees. We had information booths at a social event organized by the SABA Islamic Center and at the celebration of Hindu New Year, organized by the Saratoga City Council office. A Maitri representative gave a talk at the San Jose Kiwanis Club's social gathering on domestic violence as a community issue and on community's role in prevention.

Education Sessions: This past quarter Maitri staff presented at the Golden Gate University School of Law at their Family Law class and the International Litigation Skills Class. Maitri was also invited by Women's Center at the San Francisco State University to talk about the cultural challenges South Asian victims face in a domestic violence situation. Maitri staff conducted a training on cultural responsiveness at the 40 hr. domestic violence advocacy training session organized by AACI.

Knowledge Exchange: Maitri and nine other domestic violence advocacy organizations are part of a collaborative effort to enhance and incorporate cultural responsiveness in services provided to Asian and Pacific Islander survivors. To exchange knowledge among the 10 project partners, a conference was held in Modesto where Maitri co-presented with Marjaree Mason Center on the topic of "Touching the bar on cultural responsiveness:Beginning Steps".

Maitri Boutique

The Maitri Boutique held an incredibly successful Semi-Annual sale in January where we sold over 200 items within the first two days! Two great trunks shows in the same month also brought many new customers to our boutique. The first show was by Tania Haque, who specializes in hand-made crafts and Kurti tops, and the second show was by Sheetal Verma Joshi, a Delhi based designer who specializes in rich Indian handlooms, contemporary casuals and accessories. In February, a boutique display table at our annual gala generated a lot of interest. In March, we



had another successful designer trunk show by Saba Gul, featuring Popinjay bags, clutches and purses that combine luxurious craftsmanship with ethical business practices. The boutique also had a display for the first time at the SABA (Shia Association of Bay Area) Islamic Center.


