October is recognized as Domestic Violence Awareness Month (DVAM) nationwide since October 1987. The aim was to raise awareness and unite individuals and organizations working on domestic violence (DV) issues. While domestic violence is still very much a prominent negative issue, with awareness and activism, much progress has been made to support domestic violence survivors, hold abusers accountable, and create and update legislations to further those goals.



It is gratifying to see our community join us in raising awareness and provide support. This enables agencies such as Maitri to increase our efforts to empower those affected by domestic violence. Thanks to your support and our efforts, many of those served by us are living now in a safe environment, and many are making progress on the path to self-sufficiency. Today we are honored to share some of our client testimonies with you - testimonies that also show us the transformation of a survivor's pain into power and a violence-free life of dignity.



A Single mom of 1 with admirable career in Human Resources:

"He hit me when I was pregnant on Dec 31, 2011.He called me a psych so that he can keep me away from my baby......All of a sudden, my life changed drastically. I had nowhere to go & had nothing in my hand. God stepped in and all kind of help came through Maitri. Today I owe my everything to Maitri. I got back everything I lost / more than what I lost. I got back custody of my baby, Green card and a good job to support myself and my kid. I' am totally indebted to the whole team who supported me from nowhere to here."

A single dad of 2 working in the IT industry:

"Everything I did was always controlled by her. I felt like a caged animal, instead of being treated like a person. It took me 12 years to muster up the strength to leave my ex-wife. I stayed for the kids and in the irony of it all; I left her for the kids!Maitri paid for hotel/motel nights for weeks when there was no one who can take me and my kids in to stay with them temporarily.Maitri paid for attorney to represent me in court and that too stretched Maitri's resources beyond what Maitri was designed to provide. Not a single day goes by where I forget where I am from and how far I have come."

Engaging youth in raising awareness

The Maitri Art Fest, Show Heart through Art is brought to life by youngsters sending out a message of peace, love, compassion and human dignity through their artwork and writings. A huge round of applause to all the participants whose creativity is captured and cherished in this <u>album</u>.

Maitri with <u>Agents of Change</u> organized a teen forum on October 22nd. Teen community members shared their views on domestic violence, cultivating healthy relationships, and mental health well-being! Last Quarter @ a Glance

Last quarter Maitri staff and volunteers actively participated in different outreach activities. We did 8 presentations for colleges students, community members, and mainstream DV organizations. Maitri representatives spoke about different aspects of our work and the DV dynamics in the South Asian community. We provided 7 resources booths at big community events frequented by south Asians.

A Gathering of Asian & Pacific Islander Voices!

In July we organized a community panel inviting panelists from different Asian communities. Esteemed panelists shared their knowledge and perceptions of cultural nuances, challenges, and unique characteristics of their own communities. They also discussed perceived gender roles and how that influence and impact familial violence. This panel was one of several efforts by Maitri towards enhancing cultural responsiveness, and part of a collaborative partnership with My Sister's House, CORA, and YWCA-SV. In addition to letting us engage our volunteers in working with our clients, this training also increases our community's capacity to address abuse in the long run. All the trainers brought rich experiences of working with survivors of domestic violence, abuse, trafficking and in allied areas, and guided participants through a thoughtfully created syllabus of presentations, activities and discussions. We are grateful to all the presenters and thankful to CPEDV for developing a standardized curriculum that formed the bedrock for this training.


